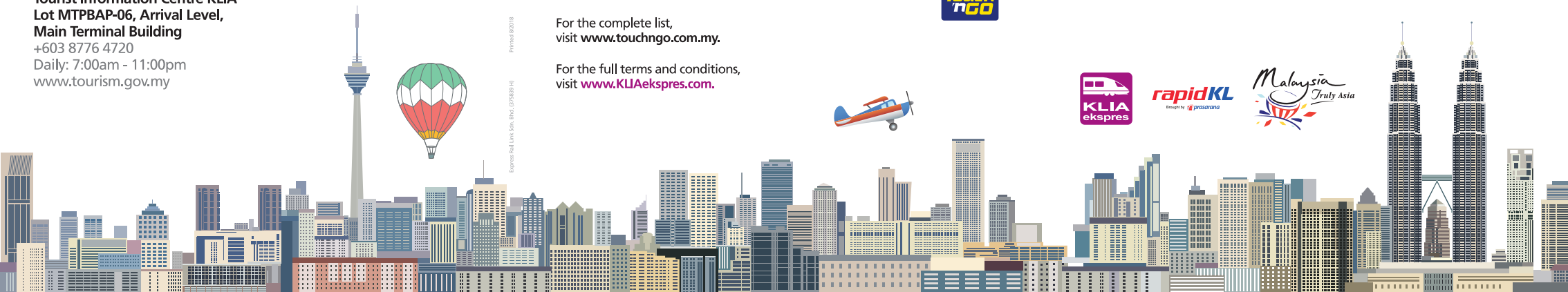

Petronas Twin Towers 1

The tallest twin towers in the world also house Suria KLCC, a premier shopping mall and Dewan Filharmonik Petronas, the home of the Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra.

Bukit Bintang (Bintang Walk) 2

This busy shopping district offers excellent food, hotel and entertainment choices for tourists and locals alike.

Petaling Street (Chinatown) 3

Enjoy the sights and sounds of the night market along this street. Food and good bargains are plentiful.

Pasar Seni (Central Market) 4

Experience the rich culture of all the races in Malaysia at this market. Here, you can get beautiful souvenirs such as local handicrafts and batik.

Station: Pasar Seni

Brickfields (Little India) 5

You can find traditional Indian goods from saris and spices to local delicacies and banana leaf lunches in the city's vibrant Little India, Sri Kandaswamy Temple and Buddhist Maha Vihara Temple are located nearby.

Station: KL Sentral

National Museum 6

This Minangkabau palatial structure showcases Malaysian history, culture, arts and crafts, outdoor displays of transport modes, an old timber palace and an aboriginal craft museum.

Station: Muzium Negara

National Mosque 7

Built in 1965 with a capacity for 15,000 people, the mosque's key features are a 73-metre-high minaret and a 16-pointed star concrete main roof, which is reminiscent of an open umbrella.

Islamic Arts Museum 8

Located within Perdana Botanical Gardens, it is the largest museum of Islamic arts in South East Asia with over 7,000 artifacts from the Islamic world.

Station: Kuala Lumpur

KL Tower 9

This communications tower is the 7th tallest freestanding tower in the world. The tower head contains a revolving restaurant and an observation deck that provides a panoramic 360-degree view of the city.

KL Forest Eco-Park (Bukit Nanas Forest Reserve) 10

The only virgin tropical rain forest left in the heart of the city. There are jungle trails, an information centre and a canopy walk.
